A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

My dear brothers and sisters in our Lord Jesus Christ,

Today we recognize and bless all of our families starting sacramental preparation for our fall First Penance-First Communion and Confirmation – it is an exciting time for them individually and for the parish collectively! Please keep these families in your prayers.

This weekend we welcome our new seminarian intern, Nicholas White, who has taken up residence here at St. Max and will be with us for the next year ministering full-time before he returns to the seminary next August for his final year of study before ordination to the priesthood. Our best wishes and prayers for abundant blessings upon him as he joins our parish community. Welcome, Nicholas!

Thanks to all our council and commission members and ministry leaders who were able to attend the Day of Reflection last weekend. What a great day with so much for us to reflect on and "take with us" as we minister together this upcoming academic year!

And, also from last weekend, I'd like to apologize to all teachers and students who were at the 12 Noon Mass where I forgot to pray the prayer of blessing to begin your new school year. Please be assured that you are in my prayers for a successful beginning to your school year!

As I meet with parents of our 2017-2018 First Communicants I often ask what they think are the challenges of raising a Catholic family in today's world. The two most common answers are modern cultural norms being contrary to Church teaching and the "busy-ness" of modern-day family life. Today's Pauline epistle reading, despite its brevity, echoes the former of these two sentiments. "Do not conform yourselves to this age, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect." Often in today's society the standard is that our feelings are the most important. But Paul calls for the "renewal" of our minds. Thus we must sort out things intellectually if we are serious about seeking the truth, i.e. what is good and pleasing and perfect. The questions we must pose to ourselves are not "How do I feel?" or even "What do I think?" The important questions for us are "What is the truth?" and "What are God's Word and God's commandments calling us to and challenging us to think, say or do?"

Thanks to everyone who is participating in our *Together We Grow* campaign. Having surpassed our Phase I goal in pledges, now just one year after the official end of the campaign, we have already collected over \$1,000,000 of those pledges! For those who are newer to the parish or were unable to participate in our *Together We Grow* campaign last year, it is never too late to get involved and support the parish and the archdiocese in the important work of this campaign. Please give your participation prayerful consideration. And for those who have pledged, thank you for fulfilling your pledges in timeframe you promised.

This Monday, September 4, is the Labor Day holiday – Mass will be at 9:00 AM. All are invited that morning to bring tools of your trade to be blessed at the Labor Day Mass. And in just one week, on Sunday, September 10, we will have our annual parish picnic at the Niederman Family Farm - plan ahead to join us and pray for good weather that afternoon!

A Note From Fr. Simon Peter



I am Fr. Simon Peter Wankya from the Soroti Catholic Diocese in Uganda. I was born on November 30th 1964 in Soroti, Uganda and given the name Wankya which means 'one born in the morning'. My father was a primary school teacher and my mother was a house wife. They are both deceased. They had 12 children but one has passed on. I now have four sisters and six brothers. I am the fourth born. I belong to a fishing tribe called the Bakenyi. If my father had not been a school teacher I probably would have been some fisherman somewhere on the waters of Lake Kyoga as many of my tribesmen are. However like my patron, St. Simon Peter, I find myself not a fisherman but a fisher of men for Christ.

I never went to a Kindergarten as they never existed at our time but instead went straight to do my primary school education. After primary I went for secondary education for four years in the Minor Seminary and thereafter to high school. After high school I joined the Major Seminary to do Philosophy and Theology and was ordained a priest on July 10th 1993. My older brother Francis is also a priest and is currently teaching in one of the Major Seminaries in Uganda.

Since ordination I have served in the following capacities: as an associate pastor, as a pastor and as vocations director of our diocese until recently. I have been serving as pastor of St. Patrick's Parish in the village of Madera before coming here to St. Maximilian Kolbe. At St. Patrick's there are two priests serving a population of close to 30,000 Christians. These are spread out in 72 outstations in the different villages of the parish. These outstations are managed day-by-day by catechists whom we have trained to lead Sunday services, break open the word of God to the people, visit and pray for the sick and bury the dead when the priest is unavailable.

Our parish has 145 catechists who come every month to the parish for meetings to prepare Sunday reflections for the month and share any pastoral issues affecting the people and their work. Some of the catechists have to travel many miles to come to the parish, on foot or using bicycles. The priest visits these outstations probably two or three times a year to administer the sacraments. The most common visits to these outstations are administration of sacraments to the sick. Some villages and homes are quite distant from the parish and not easily accessible. There are no paved roads like here but small paths which are sometimes narrow and bushy. The common feature of homes is round grass huts without electricity or running water.

Many of our outstations have made an effort to try to put up local grass thatched shelters which are used for prayers by the congregation every Sunday. A few are making an effort to build permanent structures of bricks and iron roofs. The main parish church too is still under construction with the roof now on, but lacking door shutters, windows, paint, electricity and pews.

What a beautiful country this is with paved roads, electricity, running water and beautiful church buildings where people come daily and on Sunday for Mass in their cars and sit and pray comfortably. Thank you for accepting me to come and share with you my life, culture and faith. I thank God who chose and bestowed upon me the priesthood that has enabled me to come to this country to spread His Gospel. To God be glory and praise forever.

EVANGELIZATION & CATECHESIS

GOSPEL FOR ALL AGES

Matthew 16:21-27

Peter was expecting a Messiah that would carry out a different plan than the one Jesus had explained. Jesus was indeed the Messiah, but His life and death would show a different understanding of what it means to be the Messiah. We too have expectations of God and our own ideas about what we think God ought to be doing in our world. Like Peter we may risk limiting our image of God by thinking only in human ways. God's plan is always more than we can ever imagine.

Living the Word

As you gather as a family, talk about what we expect God to be doing in our world and in our family life. Then read today's gospel, Matthew 16:21-27. Why do you think Peter was so upset by what Jesus was saying? Notice how Jesus reprimands Peter. Do we sometimes get discouraged because God doesn't act in our world in the ways that we expect? Pray together that your family will remember that God is always working for the world's salvation in ways that are beyond our human imaginings. Conclude by praying together today's Psalm, Psalm 63.
